Check Developmental Milestone at age of 6 Month

Young child plays, talk, smile and different acts offers important clues about child's development. These developmental milestones are very important gives clues about things most children can do by a certain age. Parent needs to understand it and check the milestones level of the child.

Appears shy or nervous with strangers Cries when mother or father leaves Shows favourite things and people Makes sound or actions to get attention from family members Puts out arm or leg to help with dressing Enjoys games such as "peek-a-boo" and "pat-a-cake" Responds to simple spoken requests like "come here" Uses simple gestures, like "no" or waving "bye-bye" Tries to imitate words or sounds (sounds like speech) Says "mama" and "dada" and exclamations like "uh-oh!" Explores toys by shaking, banging, throwing Finds hidden things Looks at the right picture or thing when it's named Copies gestures and imitate like drinks from a cup Puts things in a container, takes things out of a container Gets attention from other by pokes with index (pointer) finger Follows simple directions like "pick up the toy"

Act fast if you notice any of these signs

- . Doesn't try to get things that are in reach
- Shows no affection for any family member
- · Doesn't respond to loud sounds like whistle, clap
- · Doesn't respond to any sound around him like
- · Has difficulty getting things to mouth
- Doesn't vocalize with vowel sounds ("ah", "eh", "oh")
- · Doesn't roll over in either direction
- · Doesn't laugh or make squealing sounds
- Having very stiff, with tight muscles
- · Having very floppy muscle

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Check Developmental Milestone at age of 12 Months

Young child plays, talk, smile and different acts offers important clues about child's development. These developmental milestones are very important gives clues about things most children can do by a certain age. Parent needs to understand it and check the milestones level of the child.

Cries when mom or dad leaves

Afraid of strangers

Shows affection to familiar people

Hands you a book when he wants to hear a story

Repeats sounds or actions to get attention

Puts out arm or leg to help with dressing

Plays games such as "peek-a-boo" and "pat-a-cake

Vocalize sounds with changes in tone

Says "mama" and "dada"

Try to imitate adult speech

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Check Developmental Milestone at age of 18 Months

Young child plays, talk, smile and different acts offers important clues about child's development. These developmental milestones are very important gives clues about things most children can do by a certain age. Parent needs to understand it and check the milestones level of the child.

Shows temper tantrums
Afraid of strangers
Shows affection to familiar people
Plays simple pretend, such as feeding a doll
May take to caregivers in new situations
Points to show others something interesting
Explores alone but with parent close by
Says several single words, Says and shakes head "no"
Points and show what he wants, Knows common house hold

Points to get the attention of others, Points to one body part, Scribbles on his own, Can follow 1-step verbal commands without any gestures; like sits when you say "sit down", Walks alone, May walk up steps and run, Pulls toys while walking, Can help undress herself, Drinks from a cup q Eats with a spoon

Act fast if you notice any of these signs

- Not able to copy others

- · Doesn't shows interest in talk, music
- Doesn't respond to his / her name

Shows defiant behavior (doing what he has been told not to)
