What is Audiological Assessment?


AUDIOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT:

The purpose of audiological assessment is to quantify hearing in terms of the degree of hearing loss, the type of hearing loss and the configuration of the hearing loss. Hearing levels are expressed in decibels based on the pure tone average for the frequencies 500 to 2000 Hz.

DEGREE OF HEARING LOSS:

Normal hearing sensitivity	(0 to 25 dB HL)
Mild hearing loss	(26-40 dB HL)
Moderate hearing loss,	(41-55 dB HL)
Moderately-severe hearing loss	(56 to 70 dB HL)
Severe hearing loss	(71 to 90)
Profound hearing loss	(91 dB HL or greater)

Therefore, in such situation they need to make immediate examination by Audiologist and Speech Language Therapist.
